The aim for the Shirley Roberts-Young Foundation for Support & Education (The Foundation) Associate Degree Scholarship Fund is to help Belizean high school students achieve an associate degree. Two current high school students from varied schools across Belize will be awarded full scholarships for the entirety of their two-year education, provided they continue to meet the requirements set out in a signed Affidavit. These students will be selected using academic, attendance, written essay, economic, and social criteria. Scholarships will include school fees paid in full, an allowance for transportation, personal needs and school supplies, a laptop computer and printer, and other costs as may be deemed appropriate. Preference will be given to households with a single parent or guardian (e.g., grandparent, aunt, uncle, or other relative raising the child due to non-available parent) but will not exclude homes with both working adults, if meet the financial criteria. Annual household income is limited to \$24,000 BZ. Recipients will be required to complete 20 hours of community service every year by April 1st to continue receiving funds. 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- Scholarships will be awarded to recipients for them to attend St. John's Junior College or the University of Belize (UB).
- The Foundation reserves the right to approve the College selected.
- *A list of services, items, and monetary awards to be provided is included with this application.*
- Selected students and parent(s) or guardian(s) will be required to sign an affidavit acknowledging awarding of scholarship that includes commitment of student to care for items provided and stipulates those items are for sole use of student.
- Applicant will be required to provide documentation of all information (e.g., school attendance, report cards), transcript when submitting this application.
- Applicants must submit a form of identification. Selected students will be required to provide a photo ID.
- Selected students may be asked to allow The Foundation to publish their names and photos.
- Please complete the application in full and with *ALL* required documents. All incomplete applications will most likely not be considered.
- Application must be submitted as a **PDF or as a scan**. Please **DO NOT** send pictures or screen shots of application pages/essay/documents.
- All applicants must submit current school transcripts when submitting their application.
- Parents **MUST** provide complete income documentation and contact(s) for verification.
- Applicants must maintain A/B grade averages throughout the scholarship program and be willing to provide all academic updates/progress during the semesters.
- Must maintain a minimum 95% school attendance rate.
- Complete 20 hours of community service per school year, due by April 1. Must present evidence that supports this, such as an affidavit signed by the organization.

Note: being part of an organization or club, or having extracurricular activity is not a criterion for scholarship, but may be used as additional information
